

Changes to OASIS password requirements

To further protect your information and to tighten security, Information Technology will be implementing a change to all Oasis Portal accounts. This change will enforce minimum password requirements and will require you to create a new password to comply with the College's password standards.

The change will be implemented for all users, in groups, beginning on the morning of Wednesday, August 29th. No system outage is expected.

How will this affect you?

Once your group is assigned, the **OASIS Web Portal** will prompt you to update your password upon your next login attempt.

Your new password must meet the following:

- Minimum of 8 characters
- Contain at least three (3) of the following password complexity requirements
 - Uppercase alpha characters (e.g.. A, B, C, D, E, ... Z)
 - Lowercase alpha characters (e.g. a, b, c, d, e, ...z)
 - Numbers (e.g. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, ...9)
 - Special characters or punctuation (e.g. ! @ # \$ % ^ & * + > < { } ?)

All passwords should be treated as confidential. Your Oasis password should be unique from every other password you currently use. While the system will not enforce it, you are encouraged to avoid a password that is based on personal information (names of family members, pets, etc.)

As a reminder, here is some additional information from Columbia College Chicago's password policy:

All passwords should be treated as confidential information. This password shall be unique from every other password the user has. Passwords shall never be written down or recorded along with corresponding account information or usernames. Passwords shall not be shared with any other individual. Users should always be mindful of their surroundings when entering their password (e.g. ensuring no one is looking over their shoulder). If the password is forgotten, users must contact the IT Department for password reset. If you suspect your account password to be compromised in any way, immediately report the incident to your supervisor or Client Services.
